
THE PIPER DANNY WESTON





WOULD THE REAL STANLEY CARROT PLEASE STAND UP?



Will these seemingly gentle allies be able to protect lonathan from the attacks of the demons, and will Jonathan be able to resist the promises of power that Hell will offer him?



BILLY'S BLITZ BARBARA MITCHELHILL







A futuristic thriller featuring a girl character it's impossible not to like!




The authorities are cruel and inhuman and Mira is on her own until Adam, her handler, falls for her and decides to defect from the authorities and help her.


OTHERGIRL NICOLE BURSTEIN
