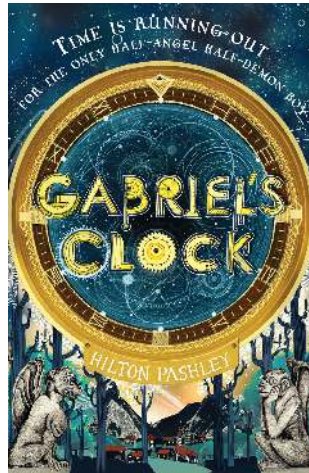

About The Book:

Some Discussion Points And Questions:

- Jonathan gets a bit of a shock when he wakes up at the beginning of the book in a strange room, surrounded by people he doesn't know. How would you feel if you were in his position?
- When we first meet Ignatius he is mourning the loss of his wife and young son. How do you think this might affect his relationship with Jonathan?
- Elgar is really a demon boy but he's stuck in the shape of a cat. Do you think he enjoys it or does he want to be a boy again? In what ways does he show this?
- What are your first impressions of Cay? How do you think she has coped with being the daughter of a werewolf and the only child in Hobbes End until Jonathan arrives?
- Rook, Raven and Crow are nasty pieces of work. Do you think they came to suitably sticky ends or should something else have happened to them? Do you have any suggestions?
- Hobbes End is full of people with secrets. For example, why do you think Professor Morgenstern or one of the other villagers is living there? Can you think up a character of your own and give them a reason to live in the village?
